Yes  The Public Private Partnership Section of Planning & Development Department headed by Chief PPP, got approval of the following Acts & Rules:  i) Public Private Partnership Act 2020" (superseding the PPP Act, 2014) ii) Constitution & Functions Rules 2021 iii) Selection of Private Partner Rules 2021 iv) Project Development Facility (PDF) Guidelines 2022 v) Viability Gap Fund (VGF) Rules 2022.
b)	Whether the latest copy of each of the enacted Acts are available on the official website of the department/subordinate department? If so the details there of, if not the reasons thereof.	Yes, the Public Private Partnership Act 2020 is available on the official website. Moreover, the PPP Section of P&D Department is in the process of developing its own website where all PPP related guidelines and other related resources will be uploaded.
